Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD) has provided safe and trusted water services to our community for 75 years. As we celebrate this milestone, we're focused on our mission – and our responsibility to carry it out in the next 75 years.

MISSION

To deliver value to our diverse customers and the communities we serve by providing safe, reliable, economical and environmentally sustainable water, wastewater and recycled water services.

Our mission is our promise to customers. To deliver on that promise, EMWD continuously improves its infrastructure. EMWD's recycled water system currently treats more than 49 million gallons of wastewater each day at four water reclamation treatment facilities. The treated water is distributed through more than 200 miles of pipeline.

EMWD's Recycled Water Program provides an important service to agricultural and irrigation customers and is an integral component of EMWD's total water supply portfolio.

The use of recycled water benefits EMWD's water supply portfolio by decreasing pressure on our local groundwater basins. Recycled water also plays an important role in achieving EMWD's goal of developing a drought proof and sustainable water supply for customers.

In 2022, an independent firm completed a Cost-of-Service Study to ensure EMWD recycled water rates accurately reflect the costs of providing these essential services. EMWD has updated the evaluation of costs and benefits related to this system and is proposing recycled water rate adjustments for 2026 and 2027 which reflect those costs and benefits, while still following the approved 2022 Study rate allocations and design methodology.

EMWD actively pursues grants and has secured millions of dollars in funding. EMWD invests in projects to reduce costs like using sophisticated AI models to review pipeline data.

Affordability is central to both our mission and operations. By keeping healthy reserve funds (like a savings account) and making savvy financial choices, we manage rising costs to keep rates as low as possible for our customers today and tomorrow.

We thank our customers and the community for their trust and support over the past 75 years. We look forward to serving you for decades to come.

RECYCLED WATER RATES PUBLIC HEARING

The Board of Directors of Eastern Municipal Water District (EMWD) will conduct a public hearing to consider changes to the recycled water rate structures and rates set forth herein. Any customers or property owners may appear at the hearing to make comments regarding the proposed changes. To file an opposition, property owners and tenants of real property who are directly liable to pay recycled water bills may submit a written protest against the proposed recycled water rate increases. Written protests may be mailed to: Eastern Municipal Water District Attention: 2026-2027 Proposed Rates, PO Box 8300, Perris, CA 92572-8300 or delivered in-person to: Eastern Municipal Water District 2270 Trumble Rd, Perris, CA 92570. Protests may also be submitted at the public comment portion of the public hearing. Protests must include: your name, parcel number and/or service address, your signature, and a statement specifying that you are protesting the recycled water rate increases. All written objections must be submitted before the public comment portion of the public hearing as stated above and a failure to timely object in writing bars any right to challenge that fee or assessment through a legal proceeding. Challenges to Board-adopted rates are subject to a 120-day statute of limitations.
